Prioritizing chores day after day, week after week, can feel daunting. However, a visual reminder will help everyone see how hard they have worked and how much they have accomplished.

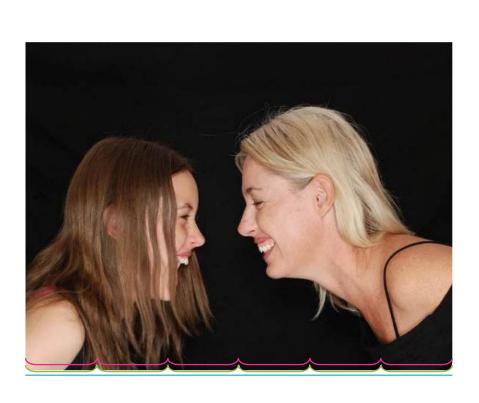


2. Track
